Coaches Report:

Another disappointing result with so much at stake, however we need to be realistic about where we are at right now. For the most part I thought our level of effort was good apart from the last 12-15 minutes of the second quarter where we surrendered a 3 goal lead to go into the main break a few goals down. A lack of intensity for that period cost us the game in the end. The reality for us right now is that we have key 'starting 18' players missing for a variety of reasons such as injury, work and school football. Adams, Harley, LVR, Quinn, Deka, Peckett, Clements, T Hirst (work) and Ben Mitchell (Stingrays) are not out on the ground and it is hurting us particularly when facing the better sides in the competition. It reduces our ability to get some consistency of performance and gain the benefits of putting the same side out on the park a few weeks in a row. The upside is that we have discovered some of our U/18's in Jaiden Peters, Jason Bedford and Justin Smith have all got exciting futures with the club and Jimmy Martinson in his 2 senior games has had a real impact. We have used 36 players in the ones this year so far and look likely to introduce a few more before the year is out, which is a positive moving forward into next year. It is always exciting being able to give players opportunities to show what they have got. Once again we will lose a couple but hopefully regain a couple of senior players for our massive game against Mt Eliza. I think it is great that we are playing the top sides over the next few weeks as it gives our more inexperienced players a real introduction into what it takes to play at the top level in this competition. These experiences will be invaluable and should provide a fair bit of motivation and a few clues as to the work that needs to be done over summer in order to close the gap on the top 3 teams and ourselves in 2010 and beyond.

Make no mistake we expect a contribution from all 22 in Contested ball, Tackling, Blocking, Spoiling and accountability. If everyone contributes in these areas the rest will take care of itself. 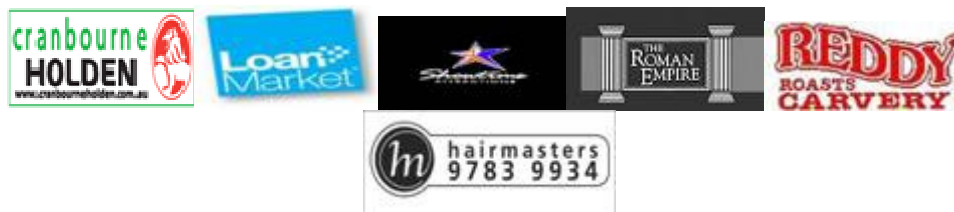
