### Coaches Report

It was a great lesson as to what can happen if as a team we make the choice not to work hard. Quite simply, when the opposition had the ball our players did not apply enough fierce pressure to win the ball back. We were lazy, selfish, and soft and we did not do the things we all said we would. We will be judged on our actions not our intentions and at the end of the day, the game was obviously more important to the Edi Asp players than ours. They had 58 tackles to our 25, we only had 69 Selfless Acts (tackles, shepherds, pressures etc) compared with 90 in rd 1. When we did have the ball, we butchered it both around the ground and in front of goal. However, despite playing poorly and not being hard enough we were in the game for  $\frac{3}{4}$  and somehow got ourselves in front. This should illustrate to our boys that we are capable of beating anyone in this competition, but only when we are fully committed to doing the hard things for 4 quarters.
